The group had ceased to meet two years before and Andrew is now a Scout Leader for a group open to boys and



girls aged 10 to 15. The group's activities already include camping, water-sports and other outdoor pursuits and his winning prize of a £500 bursary will be used to start a scout marching band. Andrew gives a lot of his free time as a volunteer in the school's music department, and he hopes eventually to establish musical links between the school and the scouts.

We wish Andrew well as he competes in the national finals over a weekend at the end of February.
