Dear Parents

A reminder to parents dropping off boys outside the school: Last Thursday the police were stopping cars and booking drivers who did not obey the signs. If you really have to drop your son off, please do it well before the road narrows or, preferably, get your son to walk to school from further away. We have had two serious accidents during the past two years.

Changes to Free School Meals Entitlement: Changes are being implemented in the entitlement to Free School Meals to take effect from 6 April. At present the entitlement applies to children whose parents are in receipt of Income Support and Income Based Jobseeker's Allowance; from 6 April, children of parents who are in receipt of Child Tax Credit, who do not receive Working Tax Credit and who have an annual taxable income of less than £13,230, will also be entitled to receive a free school lunch.

If you wish to apply for free school meals for your son, please contact the school office for an application form. When submitting the form parents need to provide evidence of the benefits they receive. Parents are also reminded that, should their circumstances change, they should inform the school at once if their son is no longer entitled to receive a free meal.

It has been a busy term that ends in a flurry of activity. I hope many parents will join us for the Year 9 Parents' Evening on Tuesday, 8th, the Spring Concert on Thursday, 10th, the PTA Auction on Friday, 11th, and Review Day on Tuesday, 15th April.

The examination season will be upon us before we know, and the school holiday should be an ideal time for structured revision, especially for Years 9, 11, 12 and 13.
