TECHNOLOGICAL DEVELOPMENTS



The ICT Support Unit at KNBS continually strives to improve the ICT facilities available to staff and students. Our focus is moving towards increasing access to ICT outside normal school hours and using ICT to improve communications. Our school website has played a major part in delivering these services and has become a fantastic resource for the school community. Only this week the website has received the EduNET Choice Award for "providing and maintaining valuable educational content".

Building on the success of the website, the ICT Support Unit has already expanded its infrastructure to enable access to staff and student e-mail accounts from any computer anywhere. We are now launching our latest development – **KNect**, which will allow staff and students to connect to the school's computer network from home, a public library or an internet café. Once connected, users will be able to access their own files and folders, the school's private intranet and various shared resources. Phase Two of the project will also allow students to deliver homework electronically to their teachers – who will be able to mark it electronically!

Football:

<u>Year 7</u>:

District Cup Round 2 v Frankley High School (home): After a month of waiting, the Year 7's finally managed to play their second game of the season as we entertained an unbeaten Frankley side. The boys took out their frustration about waiting to play by taking an early 2-0 lead with goals scored by Sam Farnell and Joe Peach. Frankley responded by scoring two quick breakaway goals. Carl Tolley then put us back in front, and we maintained this lead thanks to a brilliant penalty save from Jack Bentley. Just before half-time Jon Stephens made it 4-2 with a well-taken goal from the edge of the area. The second half was all oneway traffic, and we missed many chances before late goals from Carl Tolley and David Budden finally secured a deserved victory.

West Midlands Trophy Round 1 v Bishop Walsh (away): The first round of the Cup gave us a hard away tie against Bishop Walsh School in Sutton Coldfield. In very blustery conditions the boys started fairly well and looked to be coping well with the wind. However, just before half-time a free kick caused panic in the defence and Bishop Walsh took the lead.



The second half saw Bishop Walsh take the game to us, but a neat breakaway goal from Carl Tolley made it 1-1. However, as we searched for a winner, they broke away to regain the lead. In the final

District League v Bartley Green School (home): Just two days after the narrow loss to Bishop Walsh School we entertained Bartley Green School in a league match. The team was reduced to twelve players owing to absences and the Year 7 Rugby Tournament being played on the same day. However, this did not deter the boys from producing their best display yet. Jon Stephens scored with a fantastic strike from just outside the box which the opposing keeper never saw. <u>Year 8</u>:

National Coca-Cola Cup Round 2 v Smithswood (away): The boys travelled to what seemed a difficult tie with Smithswood. However, we totally dominated the game from start to finish. In very difficult weather conditions the boys took control in the early minutes with a goal from *Gary Richards*. With 'man of the match' *Stuart Cottrell* running the midfield, it was not long before the score was 3-0 with another strike from Gary Richards and one from *Adam Smythe*.

The second half was more of the same with shot after shot, and we eventually finished the game 8-0 with Gary completing his hat-trick, another goal from Adam Smythe and one each from *Elliot Hancox, Muaz Buaben and Steven Jacques.*

League v Shenley Court (away): The least said about this game the better. For the majority of the game we dominated possession and created at least twenty chances in the match, limiting Shenley to six. Somehow, though, Shenley converted two out of their three first-half chances to make it 2-0 at half time, and only a fantastic save from *Michael Ralph* kept the score reasonable. The second half was totally different: straight from the kick-off we pulled a goal back after great work from 'man of the match' Elliot Hancox set up Adam Smythe, who finished well. Then a great strike from Stuart Cottrell put us level. The match was then all one way with the Shenley keeper producing some excellent saves. However, he was left stranded as Smythe broke the offside trap and rounded the keeper to make it 3-2 to KNBS. Once again we continued to make chances but could not extend the lead. Shenley then had two chances and, before we knew it, they were ahead 4-3. Even though we still created chances in the dying minutes, we could not score again, and the game finished 4-3 to Shenley.

West Midlands Trophy Round 2 v Arden (home)

The draw for the West Midlands Trophy paired us with the defending champions, Arden. The boys were eager to put the defeat by Shenley behind them and started well with Adam Smythe once again netting in the first five minutes. We totally dominated the rest of the first half, but a lapse in concentration just before the interval lead to Arden equalising. In the second half the KNBS boys knocked the spirit out of the Arden team with some of the best passing football they have played in their one and half years at the school. Gary Richards made the most of a mix-up between their centre half and keeper and rolled the ball into an empty net. He then grabbed his second goal from some great work in midfield to set up an easy chance. Arden only had one shot, which came back off the post and was cleared to safety. The game finished 3-1 to KNBS. 'Man of the match' was given to Steven Jacques for some excellent play in midfield, which enabled us to dominate the game.

National Coca-Cola Cup Round 3 v Alderbrook (home): Even into the Basketball season, the Year 8 boys still have games to play. Their first after the half-term holiday was the next round of the Coca-Cola cup and saw us entertain Alderbrook. Yet again, the KNBS boys dominated the game from the start with their quick pass-and-move style of play. However, just when we thought it was going to be one of those games, up popped Adam Smythe to give us a 1-0 half-time lead.

In the first five minutes of the second half Alderbrook threw everything at us, and only two fantastic saves from Michael Ralph kept us in front. From then on we again took control with 'man of the match' *Michael Mcdonald* making sure nothing came past the midfield. He then set up Smythe for his second goal with a great cross that was headed home well. Substitute *Joe Howes* then made the game safe with a well-taken individual goal to make it 3-0 to KNBS.

District Cup Round 2 v Lordswood (home): Another cup win for the boys in what turned out to be a comfortable game in the end. Adam Smythe scored early on as he followed up a shot from the edge of the area. How we did not score any more in the first half is a mystery. Lordswood then equalised with a shot-come-cross, which went over Michael Ralph's head. The second half ended up being a one-lad show with 'man of the match' Joe Howes running the Lordswood defence ragged and scoring five times (the second time he has done this in two years).

The match finished 6-1 to KNBS, and we now face either Kings Heath or Archbishop Ilsley in the quarter-final in February. Once again a big thankyou from Mr Holme to all the parents who have supported both the Year 7 and 8 teams.

<u>Year 9</u>:

<u>v Bartley Green</u>: The boys faced a strong Bartley Green side and found themselves virtually out of the game at the very start. *Ricketts and Taylor* scored for KNBS but could not stop Bartley Green running out winners 5-2.

v Aston Manor: The boys performed at their best against Aston Manor. It was always going to be a tough game for the lads, as Aston were a very big and physical side. KNBS took the lead through Ricketts, which was against the run of play. In the second half the game was more even, and the score was level again after the centre midfield player delivered a pile-driver past the impressive **Bailey** in goal. The 'never-say-die' attitude of the boys won through again with **O'Reilly** and Ricketts proving as difficult to catch as a box of frogs. With minutes to go O'Reilly fed the ball to Ricketts, who slapped the ball into the corner past the hapless Aston keeper. A 2-1 victory based on commitment and effort - well done, lads, we are having a great season. Special mention should go to Forbes and *Murphy* who were pillars of strength in the KNBS defence.

<u>Year 10 v Bournville</u>: The boys are still unbeaten this season after a 4-0 win over Bournville. KNBS were by far the better team, and the game seemed to drift by with no real goalmouth action.



It was not until the last fifteen minutes that KNBS began to turn the screw with *Skerrett (2) and Daniels* scoring goals which, together with a Bournville own goal, gave the boys a well-deserved victory.

Year 11: The Year 11 lads have made a good start to the season, losing just one of their first six fixtures. In the opening match KNBS dominated the game against Frankley to win 3-1. They then fielded a weakened team against Wheelers Lane. The team performed above expectation to record a creditable 1-1 draw. A league game against Baverstock produced the poorest performance, yet an excellent goal by *James Pugh* from an acute angle earned a 1-1 draw.

The only defeat came against a very strong Archbishop Ilsley side. After twice going behind, KNBS first equalised with a *Neil McGrillen* penalty and then pulled level for a second time when *Richard Bishop* scored from twenty-five yards out. However, all the good work counted for nothing when Ilsley scored the winner with only minutes remaining.

In the District Cup Year 11 again dominated the game to beat King's Norton High School 4-0, the pick of the goals being a chipped shot from *Alex Douglas; Luke Wilkins, Jon Ford and John Couch* scored the other goals.

The best performance came in the Blues Cup against Baverstock, when all players performed to their peak. Jon Ford scored a hat-trick, two of the goals being created from catching defenders in possession. The decisive goal came a minute into the second half when Neil McGrillen scored with a free kick taken from just ten yards into the opponents' half. This looked spectacular as the ball hit the bar and bounced over the line and into the top of the net. KNBS ran out 4-0 winners.
