Dear Parents

Most of you will by now be aware that I am to retire at the end of this term, and I am delighted to inform you that, just before the Easter break, the governors appointed Mr Roy Baylis to take over in September. Mr Baylis and I have already begun to work together for a smooth changeover as a springboard for the school's continued development and improvement.

About half of the boys in the school have important public examinations this term, and I hope that Years 11, 12 and 13 students are well into a balanced and disciplined revision timetable. There is an enormous wealth of supporting advice and information available for your sons, but no internet website or teacher can write the examination for them; they need to think about, understand and learn the ideas with greater care and thoroughness than they have ever shown before. Parents can help so much by supporting a panic-free and disciplined build-up to a peak of knowledge and understanding.

School examinations begin for Years 7, 8 and 9 on Monday, 10 May, and for Year 10 on Monday, 17 May. Year 9 have impressed us with their approach to SATs this week, and we wish all boys a successful time in the weeks ahead.

We congratulate Andrew Lomas, Head of Religious Education, on being one of four secondary school teachers on the regional shortlist for the annual Teaching Awards. Andrew, who is just one of many KNBS staff who enrich the boys' experience of school, has much appreciated the supportive comments made by colleagues, pupils and parents. We wish him well when the winner is announced at a ceremony in June.

Notification has been received concerning a change in the allowances for Free School Meals with effect from April 2004. Please note that to qualify for free meals for their children parents should be in receipt of Income Support, Income Based Job Seekers Allowance or Child Tax Credit with an annual gross income of not more than £13,480 (previously £13,230).

As we celebrate the wealth of activity and success described in this Newsletter, we may have to look carefully to spot details of the annual PTA Quiz on 21 May; I hope to see you there.



SPORTS NEWS Year 7 Basketball:

'Participation to reach Potential'

The boys reached the quarter-finals of the Birmingham Championships by winning their league and now faced the difficult task of overcoming a strong Ninestiles side. Our shooting radar seemed to be way off in the first half as we struggled to trouble the scorer. At half time the score was KNBS 5–Ninestiles 16.

The boys turned the game around in the second half and, to use the old cliché, 'It became a game of two halves'. *Loat, Flower and Heslop* rained shots in from all angles, and the boys demonstrated a real desire to win. The final score was 25-18 to KNBS; the semi-finals await!



Semi Final v Harborne Hill: The boys tried to make it to yet another final when we were drawn away to Harborne Hill. When we arrived, we knew we faced a very difficult game because of the size of some of their players (three of them being 6 ft and above!!!). However, in the first half size didn't matter, as we outplayed them, limiting them to shooting from way out, whilst our speed left easy chances which we took. At half time we led by 14 points to 8.

The second half was a totally different story as our boys struggled to counteract the height difference whilst also forgetting the basics and trying the impossible. In fact, we only converted two baskets in the second half as Harborne Hill ran out eventual 26-18 winners. Well done to all those who played throughout the year, and with more practice we can hopefully make the required final step next year.

Football:

<u>Year 7</u>:

District Cup Semi-final v Turves Green: The Year 7 boys entertained Turves Green for the second time in a week. Again it was a very close game with both teams going close to breaking the deadlock. At full time the score was still 0-0. We entered seven and a half minutes each way of extra time, and both schools still struggled to break the deadlock as the defences took control. With two minutes to go and penalties looking likely, the ball went out to the right; a great cross followed, which picked out an unmarked Jon Stephens, who crashed the ball in. We then defended with ten men behind the ball for the remainder of the game and took our place in the final against St Thomas Aquinas. 'Man the match' was Jon Stephens for his goal and a great midfield display.

District Cup Final v St Thomas Aquinas:

The lads went to Wast Hills hoping to defend the Malcolm Daniels Trophy won by the current Year 8. In blustery conditions the boys took early control and went close on numerous occasions but could not find the target.



The second half produced more of the same, and a great fifty-yard pass from *Graham Loat* picked out *David Budden*, whose first shot was saved but followed up to put us 1-0 up. The final fifteen minutes saw all one-way traffic, and the score only remained the same because of some outstanding goalkeeping.

The final whistle led to joyous scenes from the many supporters who had come to cheer on the boys. The win led to another inspirational speech from Mr Preece as the boys went up to collect their trophy.

<u>Year 8</u>:

League Game v St Thomas Aquinas: After qualifying for the Birmingham Schools' final and the District Cup semi-final, the boys tried to catch up on the league games that needed to be rearranged because of our extended cup runs. Our next game was against St Thomas Aquinas, which also saw the return of Mr Kafai. In a tense first half we took an early lead only to be pegged back. Eventually, we decided to return to our normal passing game and led 3-1 at half time. The second half was all one way, as we threatened to beat our record of 13 goals in one game. We eventually settled for a 7-1 victory, which was even better because it saw some of the squad's players grabbing their first goals of the season. 'Man of the Match' was **Tom Wilson**, who capped a great display with a hat-trick, with **Jamie Summers** also scoring. As usual, **Joe Howes** grabbed another two, and his strike partner **Adam Smythe** also got on the score sheet once again.

District Cup Semi-final v Turves Green: The night after the Year 7's beat Turves Green in their semifinal, it was the turn of the Year 8's to try and repeat the feat. In a rather tense opening we tried in vain to break down a stubborn defence. In fact, it took a great passing display to get in behind them, and Adam Smythe didn't disappoint with a cool finish when one-on-one with the keeper. This managed to settle the nerves, and we took control from this point, but some good goalkeeping kept the score to 1-0. Right on half time Joe Howes picked the ball up on the edge of the area and smashed a shot into the bottom corner.

Again, the second half was all one way, and another goal was just a matter of time. It was *Stuart Cottrell* who struck from outside the area to book a place in our second final of the year.

League Game v Bishop Challoner: In what turned out to be our final league match because of cup commitments we entertained a very strong Bishop Challoner side. We turned out with a much depleted squad owing to injuries and because some of the team were playing in the hockey tournament. This, however, was not going to deter the boys from maintaining the winning streak they were on.

In a strong display in the first half we took an early lead with a scrambled goal from *Elliot Hancox* and were soon 2-0 up with yet another goal from Joe Howes.

The second half was very different with Bishop Challoner pushing from the start of the half. However, good displays from 'Man of the Match' *Abdi Kizildag* and goalkeeper *Michael Ralph* kept them out. Unfortunately, we finished the match with two worrying injuries as Michael Ralph and Adam Smythe both suffered knee problems which threatened to keep them out of the finals only a week away.

<u>Birmingham Schools' Cup Final v Great Barr</u>: This was to be our first of two finals in five days as we travelled to Erdington to face a very strong team from Great Barr who had previously disposed of Bournville and Colmers Farm. This was not going to stop our boys in their quest to win more trophies as we started easily the better side. With the defence working well as a unit, it wasn't long before we created our first chances, only to be denied by good keeping and wayward finishing. However, half way through the half a slick passing move from Stuart Cottrell and *Gary Richards* put Joe Howes clear, and he finished excellently. We went in at half time 1-0 up.

The second half saw Great Barr throw everything at us, but we were still dangerous on the break. However, it was Great Barr who equalised on a quick break. The boys then showed their determination by going straight up to the other end and re-taking the lead with a fantastic strike from outside the area by Joe Howes which looped over the keeper. With our backs to the wall and only five minutes left, Great Barr scored again with a scrambled effort.

This took the game into extra time, and controversy was not far away. **Ben Judd** lined up a free kick from twenty-five yards out, which he struck magnificently, the ball looking in all the way. Unfortunately, the ball crashed off the bar, and what looked like a simple tap in for Joe Howes turned into a mad scramble. From the melee Gary Richards struck the ball from twelve yards out towards the goal, it took a deflection off their centre half and looped over their keeper. Just as the lads started to celebrate, the goal was ruled out by the linesman for offside. When asked, he said that the ball had hit one of our players who was offside (something even Great Barr disagreed with!!).

The final then fizzled out with both midfields taking control and finished 2-2. In these circumstances the trophies are shared for six months each. Ben Judd won the toss and elected to keep the winners' trophy first, with Great Barr having to look after the runners-up shield first. The 'Man of the Match' award went to all fourteen players who participated in the final, as it was a great team effort.

District Cup Final v Colmers Farm: Just five days after the great display against Great Barr, we travelled to Wast Hills as defending District Champions to play Colmers Farm, who had beaten us 4-2 earlier in the year. The boys were too laid back when they arrived and struggled to play to the standards shown in the previous games. Even so, we did create some chances, which were comfortably dealt with by the Colmers keeper. Colmers eventually turned the game and scored with a good strike from their dangerous centre forward. We managed to reach half time only 1-0 down.

Half time led to stern words from Mr Holme to try and wake the boys up. However, these seemed to fall on deaf ears as Colmers went close to extending their lead. One particular chance proved to be the wake-up call required as they missed a sitter from two yards. This brought attack after attack from KNBS in an attempt to equalise, only to be denied by some good keeping. From one save the resulting corner led to Stuart Cottrell "leaping like a young salmon" and heading home the equaliser with a majestic move. Both teams again went close, but once more the final went into extra time. Only the fact that we were in the final kept the tiredness away for our boys, and both teams had great chances to win the game. The final whistle saw us share the second trophy of the year, but this time Colmers won the toss to keep the cup.
